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

 - Many located across the Commonwealth




Application and Project Workflow





Contact PENNVEST Regional Project Specialist


- Each DEP region has a dedicated PENNVEST contact

- Provide basic information regarding project
- Complete and return intake questionnaire



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Planning Consultation

- Mandatory meeting prior to submission of the PENNVEST application
- Can be held in-person or virtually
 - Applicant
 - Applicant's engineer
 - PENNVEST Project Specialist
 - DEP representatives
 - Other state officials





Environmental Clearances

- Projects <u>must</u> be "shovel ready" at the time of application submission
- All environmental-related permits must be issued and in hand
- Biddable plans and specifications must be made available for DEP review
- Contact DEP regional office early in the process to avoid delays



- Board votes on funding offers at quarterly meetings
- Applicants do not need to attend in-person
- All meetings live-streamed from Harrisburg via Microsoft Teams
- Open to public participation



7 Funding Offer

- Applicant receives copy of funding paperwork via email
- Contains all terms and conditions
 - Funding source (state or federal) with associated regulatory requirements
 - Funding amount
 - Loan vs. non-repayment amounts
 - Interest rates

Project Bidding & Settlement

Construction & Disbursement


- Construction may begin the day after settlement
 - Do not begin construction early – renders project ineligible
 - Exceptions granted via a Letter of No Prejudice (LONP) request
- Payments and change orders processed 100% electronically via PENNVEST portal
- Interest-only payments up to 36 months during construction





Inspection, Final Amortization, and Loan Repayment

- Submit final payment request via PENNVEST portal
- DEP, PENNVEST, and other state/local officials will participate in on-site final inspection
- PENNVEST reconciles final costs and moves project to repayment status

Funding Maximums

One Municipality Served

• \$11 million funding cap per application

Two or Three Municipalities Served

 \$20 million funding cap per application

Four or More Municipalities Served

- No specified cap
- Subject to approval by PENNVEST Board of Directors

*All stormwater-related projects capped at \$10 million, regardless of number of municipalities



Rate Calculations

TARGET RATE

- Median Household Income (MHI)
- DCED Early Warning Score
 - 0.5 to 1.5
 - Lowered for BIL funding
- Rate of Inflation

RESULTING RATE

- Annual debt service of proposed PENNVEST loan
- Current annual debt of borrower
- Annual O&M costs of borrower's system

Rate Calculations


RESULTING RATE BELOW TARGET RATE

- All loan
- Fixed interest rates upon application submission
 - Exception during annual rate change window each spring
- Rates vary by county
 - Go to www.pennvest.pa.gov > Tools > County Cap Rate for an updated list

RESULTING RATE ABOVE TARGET RATE

- Option 1: Reduced interest rate of 1% for full term
- Option 2: Non-repayment (grant)
 - Limited funds
 - Often prorated due to demand
- Option 3: Extend loan to 30 years

Offer Determination

- Uniform funding calculation used across all 67 counties
- Applicants will receive the best offer PENNVEST can provide in accordance with our program limitations
- No guarantees on hitting the target rate
- We suggest exploring other funding as a backup plan

Special PENNVEST Funding Opportunities

Advance Funding Program

- Excellent tool for new systems or Environmental Justice communities
- Covers upfront design costs
 - Act 537 planning costs ineligible
- Phase-specific loan up to \$2 million for 5-year term
- Interest only payments for 59 months in anticipation of PENNVEST construction loan
 - Design loan term extended to construction term once complete

Small Project Initiative (SPI)

- Loan only up to \$500,000
- Total project cost of \$1 million or less including contingency
- Quick turnaround
 - Processed outside of traditional cut-off dates
 - Apply anytime during the year
- State funds guaranteed
 - No federal dollars and associated regulatory requirements

Population of 12,000 people or less

Hookups of 1,000 or less

Agricultural operation

(narrow exceptions)



Programmatic Financing (ProFi)

- Ideal for larger systems with a list of projects to implement over a maximum three-year period
- Requires an officially adopted capital improvement plan by applicant
- Allows applicants to address multiple projects at once instead of a project-by-project basis
- Loan only, no grant
- Locks in the county cap interest rate



Lead Service Line Replacement

- Special incentives under BIL funding for lead service lines and goosenecks
 - Full lead line replacement required
 - Requires a separate application in the PENNVEST system
 - Can be paired with another project
- Higher chance of grant funding with revised financial calculation
- Risk mitigation measures must be followed per EPA and DEP rules, these are eligible PENNVEST costs




Example lead gooseneck and corroded lead service line Erie City Water Authority - City of Erie, Erie County



Emerging Contaminant Funding

- Special funding for projects mitigating perfluoralkyl and polyfluoralkyl substances (PFAS)
- Excludes projects addressing contamination from a military installation
- Uses normal PENNVEST application
- Special funding typically available in the early spring
- 100% grant if available




Homeowner Sewage Program

- PENNVEST provides funding to the Pennsylvania Housing Finance Agency (PHFA)
 - Repairs for existing on-lot septic systems
 - Replacement of existing sewer laterals
 - First-time connections to public sewage systems
- Design, construction, and permit costs for most primary owneroccupied residences are eligible; some narrow exceptions
- Fixed rate, currently 1.75%, up to a 20-year term
- Homeowners work directly with PHFA or a participating local bank
